### WORLD BROMELIAD CONFERENCE HOSTING BID

At our March 2012 meeting, the Society moved to

put our name forward to the Bromeliad Society International to serve as the host of the BSI's 21st World Bromeliad Conference in 2014.

Lynette reported to the meeting that the exploratory committee formed in February, consisting of Marie Ferdun, Troy Oden, and herself, had met a couple of times to discuss the feasibility of HBS hosting the event. They invited Sharon Petersen, proprietor of Sharon's Plants and former HBS president, who has extensive experience in administering plant shows, to join in the consultations. The committee came away encouraged and enthusiastic about the Society's ability to host the event.

The committee has also gotten positive and informative responses from Bonnie Boutwell, the BSI Vice President who oversees their conferences. She noted that no formal proposal is needed, but that to proceed, the HBS has to indicate to the BSI our desire to be considered as conference host. As BSI Vice President, she needs authorization from the HBS to nominate Honolulu as the conference site to the BSI Board, which will then pick the 2014 site and host. In the communication to the BSI authorizing our nomination, Lynette agreed to serve as chair of the conference committee, while Raleigh Ferdun will serve as treasurer.

The exploratory committee agreed to continue to meet as a standing committee, with Lynette as chair and Troy Oden as planning director, until the 2014 conference host is selected. The committee will also reach out to potential partners and participants, including HBS members, other societies, and growers such as David Shiigi of Bromeliads Hawaii. Lynette will continue to lead communications with the BSI board.

Information on administering BSI conferences is contained in their Standing Rule 14, which Troy circulated at the meeting and which is reprinted on page 4 of this newsletter. #### STANDING RULE 14 WORLD BROMELIAD CONFERENCE

The intent is to define the duties, responsibilities and expected time-line of both the BSI and affiliate group charged with the sponsorship of the WBC.

- 1. The BSI Board will solicit and confirm the selection of the sponsoring affiliate whenever possible before the prior conference so that the sponsoring affiliate may prepare a presentation and announcement at the preceding conference.
- 2. The selected affiliate will prepare a conference logo, name, date, location and provide conference registraiton rates within 6 months following the previous conference. A \$10 discount will be offered to any BSI member who fulfills the Affiliate Discount requirements as set forth by the Affiliate Chairman. The above information will bepublished in the BSI Journal and listed on the BSI website.
- 3. The selected host hotel rates and registration procedures will be publicized within 6 months following the previous conference. World conferences may be scheduled at the host affiliate's discretion, but will generally be scheduled during the time frame of June 1 September 30 with considerations given to local and regional events and site availability. The hotel contract must be reviewed and accepted by the BSI President and Treasurer.
- 4. The BSI website will be used to convey all conference information to the members. The web master will create a conference page and a pay-pal payment page to post updated information as submitted by the vice president.
- 5. The sponsoring affiliate will confirm a conference chairman and treasurer who will be responsible for on-site arrangements and who will select additional event chairmen.
- 6. The BSI Treasurer will set forth in writing an agreement between the sponsoring affiliate and BSI that will confirm the financial sharing of the conference proceeds as well as the duties and responsibilities of the conference treasurer.
- 7. All BSI World Conference schedules must include the following events: A BSI Standard Judged Show, Plant Sale, Educational Seminars, a Judges School, dinner or banquet, BSI General & Board meeting, and a Rare Plant Auction (proceeds to benefit BSI's scientific research, education & conservation endeavors). Host affiliates are encouraged to provide other events such as workshops, round table discussions, scientific seminars, post sessions, and tours of homes or gardens that may be of inerest to attendees.
- 8. The sponsoring affiliate should ensure that every scheduling consideration has been given so that conference registrants are able to take full advantage of all activities that are included in their registration.
- 9. At the BSI Board Meeting in non-conference years, the Vice President will give a detailed report on the planning progress of the upcoming event, entertain questions and suggestions as well as address any issues that may arise.
- 10. The BSI Board reserves the right to request and suggest additions and modifications to the WBC agenda as best serves the organization.
